Apprenticeship Programs



All of our crafts and signatory contractors operate state-certified training programs. All of our apprenticeships combine classroom and hands-on training with on-the-job experience. The training is free. Plus, apprentices earn livable wages while they learn.

The Regional Council, in cooperation with partner contractors, operates the largest apprentice training program in Wisconsin and the second-largest in Minnesota. Combined, we train more than 1,600 men and women for a better future.

To qualify for an apprenticeship, you must:

- - Be at least 18 years old
 - Have a high school diploma, G.E.D., or high school equivalency diploma
 - Be sponsored by a union contractor

You will have to meet the physical and performance demands of the job, pay an entry fee, and purchase basic work clothing and tools for your trade. Construction is hard, physical work, often in uncomfortable weather conditions and sometimes at unusual hours. Our members must work hard, be reliable, and show up on time

Boat Building Apprenticeship

The apprenticeship program is a paid job training opportunity where Twin Cities youth develop technical woodworking skills, social and emotional skills, and a connection to local waterways.

The program hires youth 16-19 who qualify as low-income and/or have employment barriers and they have the option to participate from 3 - 12 months. The winter apprenticeship runs from September 25 - January 17.

- **Technical:** safe tool use, measurement, wood species identification
- **Social & Emotional:** receiving feedback, cultivating a growth mindset, working within a diverse team
- **Career Readiness:** offsite field trips to work sites & college campuses, mock interviews, resume writing, financial literacy, goal setting

Featured News of the Week

Employment Projections, 2014 – 2024

DEED currently anticipates construction and extraction occupations to grow by 7.7 percent between 2014 and 2024 in Minnesota. For reference, the total of all jobs is anticipated to grow by 4.3 percent during that same time period. The 7.7 percent growth for construction and extraction occupations is equivalent to an estimated 8,722 net new jobs. Additionally, there is anticipated to be a need for 17,390 replacement hires, or for those who leave construction occupations through retirement or other means.
